


# WHEN IN DOUBT, THROW IT OUT!

## It's Time to Rethink Recycling

69% of plastic bottles don't get recycled.\*  
45% of aluminum cans end up in the garbage.\*

## Recycling is Easy

Glass Bottles & Jars

Please be sure to clean food residue off items before recycling
