EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Wilton Manors Police Department encourages anyone who has been the possible victim of a hate crime (regardless of the nature or type of incident) to come forward, report the crime or incident, and to work with us to bring the perpetrators to justice. Should you or anyone you know experience an incident of this nature and need emergency assistance please call 9-1-1, otherwise call 954-764-HELP (4357) for non-emergencies. Summary

- Six hate crimes occurred in Wilton Manors between 2017 and 2022.
- 2017 was the highest of most recent years for hate crime with three.
- 2022 and 2021 saw one hate crime each year.
- Since 2013, four of the six bias based crimes were incidents of criminal mischief/vandalism.
- The other two incidents were battery and extortion.
- Our LGBTQ+ community was targeted four times in the six incidents. The Jewish community was targeted twice, and the African American community once.
- The number of biased based crimes reported in Florida decreased 2% in 2020 (111 v. 109).
- The number of biased based crimes reported in the United States increased 31% in 2021 (8,052 v. 10,530).

MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF

The professionals of the Wilton Manors Police Department will not tolerate hate and bias motivated crimes. As such, reporting and investigating these hate crimes is a top priority for our agency. Our Police Department remains passionate in our endeavor to promote a safe Island City that one day can be free of hatred and bias. We fully understand community/police partnerships are essential to promoting positive public safety, and together we will continue working toward making our Island City a safe space for everyone. Our agency stands ready to eradicate hate through our commitment to aggressively investigating crimes predicated on bias as these offenders shall have no comfort in our Island City.

We encourage anyone in our community who has been the possible victim of a hate crime (regardless of the nature or type of incident) to come forward, report the crime or incident, and to work with us to bring the perpetrators to justice. HATE CRIME DEFINED

A hate crime is a criminal act or attempted criminal act by any person or group of persons against a person or the property of another person or group, which constitutes an expression of hatred toward the victim because of their personal characteristics. Personal characteristics include:

- Race
- Color
- Ancestry
- Ethnicity
- Religion
- Sexual Orientation
- National Origin
- Homeless Status
- Advanced Age


Under Florida's hate crime law (Statute 775.085), when a crime is proven to have been committed based on prejudice due to the victim's race, color, ancestry, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, national origin, homeless status, or advanced age of the victim:

- A misdemeanor of the second degree is reclassified to a misdemeanor of the first degree.
- A misdemeanor of the first degree is reclassified to a felony of the third degree.
- A felony of the third degree is reclassified to a felony of the second degree.
- A felony of the second degree is reclassified to a felony of the first degree.
- A felony of the first degree is reclassified to a life felony.

This may increase the punishment imposed.

Our agency monitors trends in bias based criminal activity. The below data looks at a ten year hate crime trend in our Island City.




Crimes are categorized by type, and the below chart provides information on what biased based crimes have occurred in Wilton Manors.



SECTION 3: Bias Motivation Categories

A hate crime is a criminal act or attempted criminal act by any person or group of persons against a person or the property of another person or group, which constitutes an expression of hatred toward the victim because of their personal characteristics. Personal characteristics include: Race, Color, Religion, Ethnicity, Ancestry, National Origin, Sexual Orientation, Advanced Age and Homeless Status. The following chart shows what groups have been targeted by hate crimes in Wilton Manors.

SECTION 4: Bias Incident Summaries

Department policy requires police reports be completed to document all elements of a hate crime. Reports are forwarded to the Criminal Investigations Division for follow-up investigation. When necessary, detectives work with other local, state and federal law enforcement partners to support a comprehensive investigation in our endeavor to ensure those who commit crimes of hate are held accountable to the fullest degree. The following are case summaries from hate crimes that occurred in Wilton Manors between 2017 - 2022.

OR# 43-2211-011911	30xx NE 5 Terrace	November 22, 2022
The culprit(s) wrote an anti-LGBTQ+ message on a City of Wilton Manors traffic control device (sign) defacing it.		
Arrest: No		Bias Motivation Category: LGBTQ+

OR# 43-2105-004961	Cyberspace	May 17, 2021
The culprits targeted gay men via social networking sites to extort money from them.		
Arrest: Yes		Bias Motivation Category: LGBTQ+

OR# 43-1807-009553	22xx Wilton Drive	July 23, 2018
The culprits pulled alongside the victim in a car and yelled anti-gay words. The culprit then threw an egg at the victim striking him.		
Arrest: No		Bias Motivation Category: LGBTQ+


OR# 43-1709-012716	29xx NE 6 Avenue	September 19, 2017
The culprit(s) painted anti-Jewish words on the county bridge defacing it.		
Arrest: No		Bias Motivation Category: Jewish

OR# 43-1708-011526	24xx NE 8 Terrace	August 22, 2017
The culprit(s) trespassed onto private property where they wrote anti-LGBTQ+, anti-African American and anti-Jewish words on a table.		
Arrest: No		Bias Motivation Category: LGBTQ+, African American, Jewish

OR# 43-1705-007143	70x NE 26 Street	May 24, 2017
The culprit(s) drew anti-Jewish images on the victim's cobblestone parking space.		
Arrest: No		Bias Motivation Category: Jewish










Bias Motivation Categories
