DEMOLITION

DEMOLITION

This checklist is designed to expedite permit application processing by ensuring that all required documentation is submitted with your application.

REQUIRED PERMIT APPLICATION(S)

- Building
- Electrical (if applicable)
- Mechanical (if applicable)
- Plumbing (if applicable)

MINIMUM PLAN SUBMITTAL

- One (1) copy of survey showing an original seal prepared within the last two (2) years and site plan (if applicable) showing all property lines, all buildings on the property, all easements on the property, all streets and bodies of water abutting the property. Identify which structures to be demolished and the sq. ft. of each.
- One (1) copy of asbestos survey report.
- One (1) copy of Homeowner's Association Approval, if required.
- Owner/Builder Affidavit if demolition is to be completed by Owner. This must be signed in person at the Community Development Services Department.
- One (1) copy of Broward County Statement of Responsibilities Regarding Asbestos.
- One (1) copy of Pest Control Inspection Report indicating that property is free of rodents.
- One (1) copy of FPL Disconnect Letter.
- One (1) copy of EPA License and/or letter from licensed contractor recovering refrigerant from A/C units.
- One (1) copy of documentation that the fire sprinklers have been taken out of service. (if applicable)
- Plans must show where and how water and sewer will be capped and inspection called in before demolition starts.
- Temporary Fence permit is also required.
- One (1) copy of an Erosion and Sediment Control (ESC) plan.

INSPECTIONS:

Inspections must be submitted online prior to **4:30 PM** for the next business day.
