




POLICE INCIDENTS




CRIME



Uniform crime reporting (UCR) is a collective effort on the part of city, county, state, tribal, and federal law enforcement agencies to present a nationwide view of crime. The Wilton Manors Police Department (WMPD) collects crime data and reports it to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). The FBI is responsible for reviewing submissions, and certifying their accuracy and authenticity. Data contained in this quarterly report has yet to be submitted and reviewed by the FBI. **Part I UCR Crimes categories are Murder, Rape, Aggravated Assault, Robbery, Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft and Arson.**



City of Wilton Manors Part I UCR Crime - 20 Year Perspective



This 20 year perspective into UCR crime shows an approximately 30% reduction in Part I UCR crime when comparing recent years data to the early to mid 2000's. 2008 saw 801 Part I UCR crimes marking the highest number in this timespan while 2018 saw the lowest at 481 crimes. Unofficial figures for 2021, 2022 and 2023 are 502, 506 and 523 Part I UCR crimes respectively.


Murders




Robbery




Aggravated Assaults

The FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program defines aggravated assault as an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. The UCR Program further specifies that this type of assault is usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or by other means likely to produce death or great bodily harm.




Auto Theft


Larceny - Theft

The FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program defines larceny-theft as the unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. Examples are thefts of bicycles, thefts of motor vehicle parts and accessories, shoplifting, pocket-picking, or the stealing of any property or article that is not taken by force, violence, or fraud.




ARRESTS

Arrests are the result of Wilton Manors Police Officers establishing probable cause a crime has been committed. Arrests are made in the form of physical arrest called a "custodial arrest", or an individual may be issued a Notice to Appear for eligible misdemeanor offenses. Once issued a Notice to Appear, the arrestee is released with a requirement to appear in court to answer to the crimes charged. Some misdemeanor crimes such as domestic battery and impaired driving are ineligible for the Notice to Appear program.



OVERDOSE INCIDENTS




Overdoses are considered to be a medical emergency and, in many cases, can be a potentially life-threatening situation. Generally, this means that the consumption of substances was beyond the medication's recommended guidelines or beyond the body's tolerance level to manage safely. When dealing with overdose incidents, Officers and/or Medical Professionals will administer a dose or multiple doses of Narcan or Naloxone in order to reverse the affects of the substance and restore the individual back to consciousness.



GUN INCIDENTS




Gun-related violence is violence committed with the use of a firearm which may or may not be criminal. Criminal violence includes homicide, assault with a deadly weapon, suicide or attempted suicide. Non-criminal violence includes accidental or unintentional injury or death. The Gun related incidents in Wilton Manors are calculated by the incidents in which a gun was either discharged or displayed.




VEHICLE V. PEDESTRIAN






VEHICLE V. BICYCLIST






Number of Traffic Crashes - Pedestrian
