ACCREDITATION

The WMPD has been accredited by the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation since 2010. An Accreditation program has long been recognized as a means of maintaining the highest standard of professionalism. Indeed, it is a form of “best practices” that acts to protect both the police officers and the citizenship they are sworn to protect. Accreditation has proven to give a high return on investment because it protects taxpayer dollars by providing the most efficient use of staffing and equipment through the adoption and use of these “best practices.” A Police Department which attains such designation is the functional equivalent to a Doctor or a Lawyer being “Board Certified” and it means that we meet or exceed the highest standards of our respective professions. In addition, Accreditation helps in our recruiting efforts as the best police candidates are drawn to the best Police Departments. Finally, those Police Departments which are accredited tend to have a higher success rate in securing Grant Awards because of the status that comes with being accredited.


The Wilton Manors Police Department (WMPD) surveyed residents of the City of Wilton Manors between November 1 - 30, 2024. The purpose of the survey was to gauge the overall perceptions and feelings about the Department and the services it provides. It was designed to obtain areas of concern, issues of importance and how Island City residents view the Department. This is the second survey the Department has conducted independently, and the survey will be administered every year as part of a longitudinal study of the Department.

Major Findings

- Around 88% of Surveyors feel safe in the city overall.
- Roughly 67% of Surveyors agree that the police presence in their neighborhood is appropriate for their needs.
- About 76% of Surveyors believe the Wilton Manors Police Department prioritizes making relationships with their community.
- 89% of Surveyors feel WMPD officers treat people fairly.
- 58% of Surveyors had contact with a WMPD officer in the last 12 months.
- The WMPD received an average star rating of 3.9.
- 68% of Surveyors agree that the Code Compliance Officers' presence in their neighborhood is appropriate their needs.
- The WMPD Code Compliance Unit received an average star rating of 3.4.
- About 42% of Surveyors had contact with a Code Compliance Officer in the last year.
- The top public safety issues for Surveyors are:
 - Violent Crime
 - Home Burglaries
 - Hate Crimes
 - Vehicle Burglaries
- The top code compliance issues Surveyors believe need the most improvement are:
 - Vacation Rentals
 - Property Maintenance
 - Code Compliance Presence
 - Noise



QUESTION 1: PLEASE DESCRIBE YOUR PRIMARY ROLE IN OUR CITY

Surveyors were asked to describe themselves as either a resident, visitor, business owner or employee of a local business. 87% of Survey Takers described themselves as residents, with 346 of 400 answering “resident”.





QUESTION 2: HOW SAFE DO YOU FEEL WHILE IN THE CITY OF WILTON MANORS?


QUESTION 3: HOW SAFE DO YOU FEEL IN OUR CITY DURING THE DAY?




QUESTION 4: HOW SAFE DO YOU FEEL IN OUR CITY DURING NIGHTTIME HOURS?

Surveyors were asked how safe they consider themselves during nighttime hours in Wilton Manors. Most surveyors reported feeling somewhat safe, while a smaller percentage reported feeling somewhat or very unsafe.





QUESTION 5: THE POLICE PRESENCE IN MY AREA IS APPROPRIATE FOR MY NEEDS

Surveyors were asked to rate the police presence in their area and whether it was appropriate for their specific needs. Most surveyors agreed that the police presence was appropriate for their needs, while about 33% felt the police presence was not up to standard.






Surveyors were asked if they believe the Wilton Manors Police Department provided information to the community that would be deemed useful and presented in a timely manner. 310 surveyors agreed or strongly agreed. About 22% did not agree.





QUESTION 7: THE WMPD MAKES RELATIONSHIPS WITH THEIR COMMUNITY A PRIORITY

Surveyors were asked if they believe the Wilton Manors Police Department prioritized their relationship with the Wilton Manors community. 301 surveyors agreed that this was the case, while roughly 24% did not agree.





QUESTION 8: THE WMPD PRACTICES COMMUNITY POLICING

Surveyors were asked if they believe the Wilton Manors Police Department practices community policing. 275 surveyors agreed that this was the case, while roughly 30% did not agree.





QUESTION 9: WMPD OFFICERS TREAT PEOPLE FAIRLY, AND WITH DIGNITY AND RESPECT.

The question arose whether WMPD officers treated those in the community with respect, fairness and dignity. Roughly 88% of survey takers believed they were being treated fairly by officers, while 12% did not feel the same.





Surveyors were asked how satisfied they were with the Wilton Manors Police Department. 310 survey takers agreed they were satisfied with the department, whereas 22% were not satisfied.




QUESTION 11: HAVE YOU HAD CONTACT WITH A WMPD OFFICER IN THE LAST 12 MONTHS?

Surveyors were asked if they had contact with a Wilton Manors Police Officer in the last year. Out of 399 survey takers, 232 did have contact with a WMPD officer, and 167 did not.






QUESTION 12: RANK YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD/AREA PRIORITIES. SELECT #1 AS THE MOST IMPORTANT PRIORITY TO #5 AS THE LEAST PRIORITY

Surveyors were instructed to rank their neighborhood priorities by checking the boxes made available to them with 1 being the most important and 5 being the least. Over half of survey takers selected violent crime and home burglaries as a top priority for them, followed by hate crimes and vehicle burglaries.





QUESTION 13: PLEASE RATE THE WMPD'S PERFORMANCE (5 STARS = OUTSTANDING; 1 STAR = POOR).

Surveyors were asked to rate the Wilton Manors Police Department with 5 stars being outstanding and 1 star being poor. The WMPD scored an average of **3.9 stars**.





Surveyors were asked whether they believe the presence of Code Compliance officers were appropriate for their specific needs. Most surveyors agreed that this was correct, with 269 stating they agree or strongly agree.




QUESTION 15: HOW SATISFIED ARE YOU WITH CODE COMPLIANCE SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE WMPD?

Surveyors were asked how satisfied they were with Code Compliance services. 269 Survey takers felt either satisfied or very satisfied with these services and 127 expressed they were dissatisfied or very dissatisfied.




QUESTION 16: HAVE YOU HAD CONTACT WITH A WMPD CODE OFFICER IN THE LAST 12 MONTHS?




QUESTION 17: WHICH CODE CONCERNS ARE MOST RELEVANT TO YOUR AEREA. SELECT ALL THAT APPLY.

Surveyors were instructed to express their neighborhood/area code concerns by checking the boxes made available to them. The categories with the highest score indicated areas that needed the most improvement. According to surveyors, vacation rentals and property maintenance were the top two areas that needed the most improvement, whereas nuisance lighting needed the least improvement.





QUESTION 18: PLEASE RATE THE WMPD CODE COMPLIANCE UNIT (5 = OUTSTANDING; 1 = POOR).





Surveyors were asked if they attended this year's National Night Out event. Most surveyors stated they did not attend, with 329 out of 400 answering no.





Surveyors were asked to rate the National Night Out event with 5 stars being outstanding and 1 star being poor. The event received an average rating of **3.3 stars**.






Surveyors were asked to select the location they'd like the see the National Night Out event held in the future. Most surveyors opted to rotate locations at city parks/venues.




QUESTION 22: CHOOSE YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD/AREA.

Surveyors were instructed to choose the neighborhood zone they reside in. With the central area being the biggest zone, most surveyors selected this as their neighborhood.





QUESTION 23: THE PERSON COMPLETING THIS SURVEY IDENTIFIES AS...

Surveyors were instructed to choose the ethnicity they identify as. Most survey takers identified as White or Caucasian, followed by Hispanic or Latino.





QUESTION 24: THE PERSON COMPLETING THIS SURVEY IDENTIFIES AS...

Surveyors were instructed to choose the gender they identify as. Most survey takers identified as male.





QUESTION 25: ARE YOU A MEMBER OF THE LGBTQ+ COMMUNITY?

Surveyors were asked if they are a member of the LGBTQ+ Community. 73% of surveyors answered yes, 19% answered no and 8% preferred not to answer.




QUESTION 26: HOW LONG HAVE YOU LIVED, WORKED OR BEEN VISITING WILTON MANORS?


QUESTION 27: HOW DID YOU HEAR ABOUT THIS SURVEY?
