

NORTH/WEST regular garbage pickup days are **Monday & Thursday**, and your bulk trash days are: **Monday, March 16, April 20, and May 18**

SOUTH/EAST regular garbage pickup days are **Tuesday & Friday**, your bulk trash days are: **Tuesday, March 17, April 21, and May 19**

ALL recycling will be collected on your regular pickup day Monday or Tuesday of each week.

Condominium bulk pickup (quarterly): March 21.

The only holiday without trash service is Christmas Day (Friday, December 25, 2026)-no collection, no makeup date.

FREE resident shredding events are held in January and August each year.

Call 954-947-4445 10 days in advance to schedule household hazardous waste pickup.



PLEASE NOTE: Bulk pick-up is THE WEEK OF THE THIRD MONDAY each month.

Garbage & recycling are collected year-round, with the exception of Christmas Day.

WATERING SCHEDULE

Residents and businesses are limited to a two-day-per-week landscape irrigation schedule with two “watering windows.” NO lawn watering is allowed between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. any day of the week. Code Compliance is issuing citations for violations of the water usage schedule.

And, *DID YOU KNOW...*?

The oldest profession in local government is the City Clerk, which dates back to 1272 A.D. in the history of Old London. The title “Clerk” originated from the Latin “clericus”, referring to someone who could read and write, making them suitable for roles as notaries, secretaries, accountants, and recorders. This profession is considered the earliest form of public service in local government, alongside the tax collector.

Vice Mayor Chris Caputo—Growing Smarter Landscapes in Wilton Manors



As Wilton Manors continues to grow and evolve, so does our responsibility to be thoughtful stewards of our environment. One of the easiest—and least dramatic—ways residents and businesses can make a positive impact is by rethinking how we landscape our properties.

Traditional turf grass can be surprisingly high-maintenance. It’s thirsty, needy, and insists on constant attention through watering, fertilizing, and mowing—basically the diva of the landscape world. Florida-friendly, low- to no-irrigation ground covers, on the other hand, are built for our climate and thrive with far less water once established.

Options like Sunshine Mimosa and Perennial Peanut offer lush, green coverage while using a fraction of the water. Asiatic Jasmine provides a clean, manicured look that works beautifully for both homes and businesses—without demanding weekly lawn appointments. Frogfruit and Dune Sunflower bring bonus points by supporting native pollinators like bees and butterflies, proving that your yard can be both attractive and a good citizen.

Beyond saving water, these ground covers help reduce stormwater runoff, suppress weeds naturally, and hold up well during South Florida’s intense rainstorms and dry spells. They’re practical, resilient, and far more forgiving if you miss a watering day—or a few.

Choosing low-water landscaping isn’t about sacrificing beauty; it’s about working smarter, saving money over time, and conserving one of our most valuable resources. If your plants can thrive without constant supervision, that’s a win for everyone. By making intentional choices in our yards and shared spaces, we can keep Wilton Manors green, vibrant, and sustainable—without breaking a sweat or the water bill.

Commissioner Mike Bracchi— Here to Serve and Represent You!



As we spring into Spring, several ongoing projects and policy discussions deserve residents' attention. On the infrastructure front, the City is actively working on design and permitting of several major water and sewer improvements, including the NW 3rd Avenue water main replacement, with construction anticipated later this year. The City is also advancing replacement or rehabilitation of multiple wastewater lift stations, some of which are among the oldest in our system. Additionally, Wilton Manors is moving forward with installation of tidal backflow valves to mitigate flooding during king tides and other stormwater improvement projects aimed at reducing flooding during heavy rain events – an increasing concern in low-lying neighborhoods east of Andrews Avenue.

Development and mobility remain front-and-center this quarter. Broward County is advancing intersection safety and signal upgrades at Andrews Avenue and NE 26th Street, a corridor many residents use daily to access Oakland Park Boulevard and I-95. Within the City, several development applications along Wilton Drive and North Andrews Avenue are under review. And the eastside residential project at NE 26th and 15th Ave continues to move forward with construction. These projects raise real, practical questions about parking, traffic circulation, building height transitions, and construction timing. Public input at this stage directly influences final site plans and conditions, so residents who care about how growth fits into existing neighborhoods should stay engaged over the next few months.

At the state level, the 2026 Legislative Session is concluding in March, and property taxes—particularly homestead protections—are a major focus. Lawmakers are debating proposals that could increase the homestead exemption above current levels, expand Save Our Homes portability, place tighter limits on annual assessment increases for primary residences, or eliminate homestead property taxes. Any of these proposals, if approved by the legislature, would require a ballot referendum to amend the state constitution related to property taxes and would require 60% approval by the voters. While nothing has been finalized yet, these discussions matter: even small changes to homestead law can significantly affect long-term affordability for homeowners in Wilton Manors.

This quarter is less about ribbon cuttings and more about decisions that shape the next several years—how resilient our infrastructure will be, how growth is managed along our main corridors, and how state tax policy may impact household budgets. Staying informed now gives residents the best opportunity to influence outcomes before plans are locked in and laws are written.

Life in our Island City is special — and it is always worth protecting.

Commissioner Don D’Arminio—Powering a Greener Future at City Hall



I’m proud to share some exciting news about a new partnership that reflects Wilton Manors’ commitment to sustainability, innovation, and smart financial stewardship.

In December, the City officially opened a new electric vehicle (EV) fast-charging station at City Hall, made possible through a partnership with EVgo—at no cost to the City or taxpayers. Even better, this project will generate revenue for Wilton Manors while providing a highly sought-after service for residents and visitors.

Under a 15-year lease agreement (with an optional five-year extension), EVgo has installed 10 high-power fast-charging stalls in an underutilized area of the City Hall/Hagen Park parking lot near the volleyball courts. EVgo will pay the City \$3,300 per month in the first year, totaling \$39,600 in annual revenue, with payments increasing by 3% each year over the life of the contract. The new charging stations also have the added economic benefit of driving (pun intended!) daytime business to the Drive!

These chargers feature cutting-edge 350kW technology capable of charging vehicles up to seven times faster than standard chargers. In fact, drivers may add up to 100 miles of range in as little as seven minutes, helping people get back on the road quickly and conveniently. The station is one of the largest EVgo fast-charging locations in Florida, positioning Wilton Manors as a regional leader in EV infrastructure.

Beyond the environmental benefits, this project is a great example of how the City can be both forward-thinking and fiscally



responsible. We’re supporting cleaner transportation options, responding to growing demand for EV charging in our area, and creating a new, reliable revenue stream—all without impacting City services or raising taxes.



The charging station is fully operational and open to the public, with multiple payment options available, including credit cards, the EVgo mobile app, Autocharge+, and roaming partner apps such as ChargePoint. EVgo also offers subscription plans for drivers who want discounted charging rates.

I invite our community to stop by City Hall to see this new addition in action and to join us as we continue working toward a greener, more sustainable future for Wilton Manors—one smart partnership at a time.

Commissioner Paul Rolli—Proposed Property Tax Changes and Their Impact



The State Legislature is currently considering several proposals to reduce or eliminate property taxes for homesteaded homeowners. A final decision is expected by the end of the legislative session in late March. If a reduction is approved, it would be placed on the November ballot for voters to decide. While a property tax cut may sound appealing, it is important to understand how it could affect the City's budget, and the services residents rely on every day.

Cities operate differently than state and federal governments. We do not collect income taxes, and only a small share of the sales tax paid locally comes back to Wilton Manors. As a result, property taxes are the City's primary source of funding for day-to-day services.

The City's total annual revenue comes from two main sources: **General Fund revenues (\$26.5 million)** that includes **\$15.2 million from property taxes** and includes other general revenue sources. The other source is **Restricted funds and charges for services from the enterprise funds (\$39.2 million)** that includes drainage, water and sewer, recycling, fire services, permitting services, and several smaller funds. These funds are legally restricted and can only be used for their specific purposes. They cannot be transferred to support general city services.

Property tax revenue supports essential city services, including police, EMS, city staff salaries, parks and libraries, senior and youth programs, street and facility maintenance, capital improvements, development services and public events and support for certain local charities.

The Police Department alone accounts for **34% of the General Fund, or \$9.0 million**, and state law requires that police funding not be reduced. That leaves **66% of the General Fund (\$17.5 million)** to cover all other services.

Eliminating property taxes on non-school homesteaded properties would reduce the General Fund's property taxes by approximately **\$6.3 million, creating a substantial and ongoing budget shortfall**—with no guaranteed replacement revenue.

With no new revenue sources to replace the lost funding, cuts to city services would be necessary. Reduced service levels could make the city less attractive to residents, businesses, employees, customers, and investors, potentially affecting property values and future investment.

If homestead property taxes are reduced, the City could raise the millage rate to offset some of the loss. This would increase property taxes on **non-homesteaded properties**, including commercial buildings and rental properties, which could lead to higher rents.

Even smaller reductions in homestead property taxes would significantly impact the City's finances. The City is actively reviewing potential service reductions and budget adjustments in the event a property tax proposal appears on the November ballot.

Spring Ahead to Prepare for Disasters

Daylight Saving Time begins on Sunday, March 8, 2026.

Residents are reminded to “spring forward” by setting clocks ahead one hour at 2:00 a.m.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency encourages everyone to use the start of Daylight Saving Time as a seasonal reminder to review emergency preparedness measures that help keep you and your family safe. This is an ideal time to revisit disaster response plans and restock emergency supply kits. Emergencies can take many forms—from severe weather to everyday incidents—so preparation is essential.



Fire Department and life safety officials also remind residents to replace smoke alarm batteries throughout their homes when adjusting clocks. Working smoke alarms save lives and should be tested regularly.

Additional reminders for residents:

- Test smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors monthly
 - Review evacuation routes and family communication plans
 - Check expiration dates on food, water, medications, and batteries in emergency kits
 - Prune trees and trim overhanging or weakened branches now, before the start of hurricane season, to reduce the risk of property damage and power outages during storms
 - Update emergency contact information and store important documents digitally
- Stay informed by signing up for local emergency alerts and notification systems

Taking a few simple steps now can make a big difference when it matters most.

Spring Cleaning in the Island City

If you're inspired to freshen up your home and garden this spring, then you'll most likely be clearing out the old to make way for the new...and that means throwing things away. While doing so, remember there are **SIX** ways to dispose of those old belongings:



Trash

The most common method is by placing common household trash street-side on your regularly scheduled, twice-weekly garbage pick-up days. Everyday items as well as those boxes of worn out old toys, clothing and nick-knacks you've been storing or not using can go into your **BLUE** trash cart. “When In Doubt, Throw It Out!”... Wilton Manors' trash is disposed of at a waste-to-energy plant that makes electricity, not land-fill mounds!

Recycle

Recycling is a great, environmentally friendly way to dispose of those boxes of old magazines you haven't been reading. Additionally, weekly items such as newspapers, junk mail, plastic containers where the neck is smaller than the body, glass jars, soda cans and tin cans should be placed in your **GREEN** recycling cart. All containers should be rinsed of their contents. Set your cart street-side once a week on your scheduled pick-up day. Remember...**NO** plastic bags or any food residue!

Bulk

For cleaning out the garage, getting new appliances or trimming the landscape, place these items street-side on your once-a-month bulk pick-up designated day. Be sure to place old mirrors and glass inside a closed box or sealed container before setting outside.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

The City has contracted with Coastal Waste & Recycling to pick up your HHW through the At-Your-Door service. This is a customized pick-up for items such as paint cans, old cleaning solutions and electronics. You must call at least 10 days in advance in order to ensure timely pickup for this once-a-month service.

Shredding

For the confidential paper items needing destruction, the City hosts shredding events through Coastal Waste & Recycling twice a year at the City Hall/Hagen Park parking lot, and includes computer hard-drive punching. Keep your eyes open for shredding event dates for destroying your old information.

Donating

Finally, for those gently used items that are not ready to be cast off, there are numerous charities and thrift stores in and around our community that will gladly re-purpose clean clothing, toys, fixtures and furniture that you drop-off.

Do You Consistently Generate More Waste Than You Can Fit in Your Blue Garbage Cart or Green Recycling Cart?



All trash and recycling items placed out for collection must fit within the appropriate rolling cart with the lid closed. Overflowing carts and other types of waste containers not issued by the City cannot be picked up.

City residents may request additional garbage carts at a charge of \$19.05 each, or additional recycling carts at a charge of \$2.38 each. The charge is automatically added to your utility bill each month and is assessed for each additional cart regardless of whether the additional cart is serviced in a particular month.

Was Don Eisele Park originally a swimming pool?

We recently received the above inquiry. We’ve also been asked “who was Don Eisele; and why was a park named after him?”.

For the answers, we’ll begin in the mid-late 1950s—when developers Robert G. Lubbers and John Hoffman (Lubb-Hoff, Inc.) imagined something ambitious: two new subdivisions in far-northwest Wilton Manors; totaling 243 homes. They would be dubbed **Jenada Villas** and **Jenada Isle**. [The origin of the “Jenada” name remains unclear.]



A 1957 Fort Lauderdale News article promoted the Jenada subdivisions as far more than a place to live—they were billed as “a complete lifestyle” featuring “Fort Lauderdale’s only resident-owned recreation park.” The park would have an impressive array of amenities: a parking area, playground, small and large swimming pools, picnic grounds, a tennis court, a shuffleboard court, and even a designated space for boat docking. This was at a time when public pools were a rarity and backyard pools a high-end luxury. [An interesting sidenote: Al Hagen donated a section of his park to be used specifically for a swimming pool—but ultimately it was never built.]

Other ads for the subdivisions repeatedly emphasized terms such as “semi-private enclave” and “highly restricted”. We’ve not actually seen the restrictions, but have been told they ranged from specifying construction materials, paint and roof colors; to only allowing fold-up, umbrella-style clotheslines.

The recreation park opened **December 1957** under the ownership of the **Jenada Villas Recreation and Social Club**. It included versions of the previously described amenities; but for the tennis court becoming a basketball court. Families paid an annual membership fee to use the facility. At its prime, there was even a full-time lifeguard.

Throughout the **1960s and 1970s**, the Club thrived. Longtime residents recall birthday parties, swim races, holiday gatherings, and even neighborhood holiday parades leading to the pool. But as private pools became more common in the **1980s** and City parks expanded, the Club’s popularity declined, membership dwindled and it eventually closed and abandoned.

In **1997**, the City of Wilton Manors purchased the property for \$50,000 for its valuable river access. It was later restored as a natural park—**Don Eisele Park**; named for the Apollo 7 astronaut, Jenada Isle resident, and former City Commissioner.

Building Permits

Building permits and inspections are made to protect the present and future owners of the structure. Building permits reduce potential hazards of unsafe construction for public safety, health and welfare. Work done improperly could result in fires or other property damage. Doors and windows that do not meet code or are installed incorrectly, could fail in hurricane force winds, exposing your home to physical damage.

Building permits are required when:

- Constructing buildings and other structures, remodeling (kitchens, baths, etc.), and reroofing.
- Installing, replacing, and/or altering doors, windows, fences, pools, garage doors, screen enclosures, and driveways.
- Relocating plumbing fixtures; replacing water heaters, sewer, water lines (within the building), gas supply systems; changing water lines from the meter to the home and installation of lawn sprinkler systems.
- Installing new electrical boxes, electrical service upgrades, extending/adding wiring for new receptacles and lighting.
- Installing, altering, replacing or any other major repair of any air conditioning, refrigeration, boiler, pressure vessel, and other mechanical systems.




